We recently learned that there is a Facebook Group for DC Star that includes a fascinating pictorial record of that great band that begins in its early days in Clinton and continues through its national fame. And the band's "Best Of" album and other material is available at destarmusic.com. Here's an excerpt from an on-line review of the band's output:

"... Out of the twilight of music's pre-digital era come two definitive collections of remastered record releases by one of the best loved power rock bands of the day: DC Star. From the sweet

pop harmonies of the first single "Blue Sparks" to the bone crushing thunder of "Fortuneteller" their sound was truly unique. Their high energy performances captivated audiences and inspired a new generation of rockers throughout the northeast. DC Star consisted of vocalist Kenneth (Kenny) Taylor, Jeff Avery on guitars, keyboards and vocals, David Simmons on guitars and vocals, Henry Farmer on bass guitar and Glenn Jones on drums. Their first singles were penned by writer Jefferson Antel but thereafter the majority of their music was co-written by David Simmons and lyricist Ray McCrory. ..."

[Ed Note: I have had the Best Of album on continuous replay since I learned about its availability, and it is outstanding. The playing, the singing, the songwriting and the re-mastering are just fantastic. Go musical Hornets! (Now if we could only locate the holy grail of Surrattsville music – a recording of The Tuesday Boots! 11. <u>MORE HISTORICAL TREASURES FROM 1964-1967 SURVEYORS</u>! Here are more treasures from The Surveyor from the 1964-1967 period. Thanks to Nancy Miller (67) and the Class of 67 for donating these "journalistic time capsules" to the Foundation Archives! The following are some excerpts from the January 1965 issue:

Council Starts Many Projects: Student Council activities are centered around committees which are investigating specific projects or improvements for Surrattsville. A clothing drive for the under-privileged people of Appalachia will begin after Christmas. The purpose of this drive is to collect any usable clothing that Surrattsville students can afford to donate. Lynn Ireland, committee chair, stated that it is hoped all students will participate fully in this worthwhile endeavor. A fund to buy athletic books for the library in memory of Don Rhodes is another

student council project. Karen Bitterman, Chris Mueser, and Mr. Vaughn are presently surveying book lists and prices in order to make a good selection.

New students will find it less confusing upon arriving at Surrattsville because a committee has been set up to welcome them. Walter Madison is chair of this project and it has been in effect since the second week in December. A possible solution to alleviate traffic problems in the gym is being looked into by Ann Symkowicz. At present the committee is planning to either paint or tape aisles on the bleachers so spectators will be able to move around more freely. Two prospective improvements which are being considered include moving the trophy case from the gym into the foyer, and a bus for extra-curricular activities. More work on these projects will be continued after the holidays.

Editorial - A Hall of Fame: Each year the staff of the Surveyor appeals for a "Hall of Fame" at Surrattsville in which awards, trophies, and special honors could be proudly and prominently displayed. Until now this annual pleas has gone virtually disregarded. But recently it has come to our attention that many students feel that the inconspicuous trophy case located at the entrance of the gym does not do justice to Surrattsville's numerous athletic and academic feats. We should like to see in the foyer, or another favorable area, a display case which would house all our trophies and awards, plus a special "Hall of Fame" section honoring outstanding athletic and academic achievements of Surrattsville alumni. The Surveyor staff urges the Student Council to appeal to the Administration for the addition of, or perhaps make it a school project.

[Ed note: Thanks to these efforts in 1965, the trophy case was moved to the main lobby. And thanks to the efforts of Foundation volunteers and donors, the School now has a very impressive Legacy Hall running from the lobby toward the gym!]

12. ... AND MORE HISTORICAL TREASURES FROM "GREEN LIGHT." As we previously noted, in 2015 Duke Coleman (53) donated to the Foundation's Archives a number of copies of an early SHS student newspaper, the "Green Light." Those editions provide a fascinating glimpse into student life at Surrattsville during the 52-53 academic year, <u>66</u> years ago! Here are some excerpts from the April 30, 1953 edition:

"Music Notes: Reports on composers this week have proved interesting and entertaining. In 7B Music, June Shifflett and Jean Merriman gave a report on Frederic Chopin, with Bonnie Sellner playing a Prelude, John Page an Air with Variations, and Helen Bovbjerg a Masurka of Chopin's. The class enjoyed further information about Chopin and his music when Mrs. Moorehead played the record from our Masters series. Harriet Lusk and Kathy Hummer were the committee from 7th grade for the famous Mendelssohn. Harriet's painting illustrating "Midsummer Night's Dream" is on display and Jean Reasebeck's portrait of Mendelssohn is posted on the bulletin board. In 7A, Jay Irving and Paula Jones presented an original skit in preparation for their report.

Next week is National Music Week, and Prince George's County is honoring it by concerts throughout the County. Our school goes to Oxon Hill, in presenting a concert with Gwynn Park HS, Laurel, Frederick Sasscer, and Oxon Hill.
