SURRATTSVILLE COMMUNITY LOSES BELOVED EDUCATOR. We are sad

to report the death of one of Surrattsville's most beloved educators. Former chemistry teacher Glendal Jenkins died on December 5 near his home in Wilmington, NC, peacefully and surrounded by loved ones. Glendal's positive impact on thousands of students during his long career at SHS was immeasurable, and after retirement he stayed very busy, until just before his death at age 84, with his restoration and preservation efforts, his historical and genealogical research, his local history teaching, and a variety of other pursuits. The Foundation honored Glendal with an Annual Achievement Award in 2018
