The definitive encyclopedia of rock music in the D.C. area, "Rock the Potomac" by Mark Opsasnick, states:

"DC Star emerged from the remnants of several Southern P.G. County teen club bands

of the 1970s and became one of the Atlantic Coast's premier hard rock and roll groups. The roots of DC Star go back to Surrattsville High School, where a rock and roll scene was in full power during the early 1970s. After a little shuffling, the group's lineup consisted of singer Ken Taylor, an Accokeek native who attended Friendly High School, guitarists Jeff Avery and Dave Simmons, both Surrattsville students who had previously played together in the band Spring Fever [with Bill Smith, John Thomas, Bill Baker and Bart Windsor, all of Surrattsville], and Henry Farmer who attended Potamac High School. [At one time or another the lineup of the group and its predecessor Medusa included guitarists Avery and Simmons, bassist Baker, and drummers Wade Richards and Warren Early, all of Surrattsville.]
